Formidable Footprint National Neighborhood Exercise Series



A team of national, regional and state organizations has undertaken an effort to develop, facilitate and evaluate a series of disaster exercises for neighborhood and community based organizations entitled "Formidable Footprint - A Neighborhood Tabletop Exercise".

This series of exercises will serve as an opportunity for:

- Citizen Corps
- Community Emergency Response Teams
- Map Your Neighborhood Teams
- Neighborhood Associations
- Neighborhood Emergency Response Teams
- Neighborhood Watches

along with other community and neighborhood organizations to assess the capability of neighborhood residents to work together to prepare for, respond to and recover from a variety of natural disasters which can affect the lives of neighborhood residents.

There is **NO CHARGE** to participate in one or several of the neighborhood exercises.

The series of Formidable Footprint Tabletop Exercises will be facilitated via an internet based application entitled **ON-Line eXercise (ONX) System** which will allow each participating neighborhood to take part in the exercise from a computer in a neighbors home, at a community center or in a local church.

FEMA offers Community Preparedness Webinar

The Community Preparedness Webinar Series, hosted by FEMA's Citizen Corps Program, provides up-to-date information on community preparedness topics and resources available to emergency managers, community organizations, and the general public. Citizen Corps is FEMA's grassroots strategy to bring together government and community leaders to involve citizens in all-hazards emergency preparedness and resilience.

Collaborative Planning: Engagement of the Whole Community will provide an introduction to emergency planning, including an update on the changes to FEMA's Comprehensive Planning Guide (CPG) 101 v.2.0 - the planning guidance for state, territorial, tribal, and local planners. Key to emergency planning is the involvement of the entire community in both the planning process and implementation of the plan. Webinar participants will gain an increased understanding of the CPG 101 standardized planning process and how to engage the necessary individuals and groups as part of the planning team.
