Grange Youth become leaders.



Oregon State and National Grange Youth-Specific Programming

Horizon Leadership Program

Annually, the State Grange selects Youth Ambassadors between the ages of 16 to 21 and Young Couples between the ages of 18 to 35 to represent their Grange Youth Program.

State and National Youth Officer Team

The Youth Officer Teams are hallmark groups of Grange Youth selected through a competitive process. Daily practices during the annual conventions prepare the team to perform an impressive drill and open one day of the State and National Sessions.

Young Adult and Teenager Recognition

Members receive recognition during the State Grange Convention for their participation in Community Granges and for an essay they submit.

Public Speaking and Sign-A-Song Contests

Delivering prepared and impromptu speeches and radio spots develop public speaking skills and build self-confidence. Grange members can learn sign language, develop awareness of the hearing impaired and use sign language to communicate the words of a song. Winners represent Oregon at a regional competition.

G.R.O.W. Club

The G.R.O.W. Club continues to “go right on working” for youth programs, as an alumni program for all past Grange Youth representatives. It also sponsors an annual scholarship for Grange representatives to further their education.

Achievement Awards

The National Grange Youth Achievement Award program recognizes youth for their service at all levels of the program. Focus areas include public speaking, legislative experiences, deaf education, drill and professional development.

Grange Family of the Year Award

We recognize the accomplishments of a Grange family in their local community as an example for members and non-members.

National Grange Legislative Experience

Each year, a Grange Youth is given the privilege to take an active role in the legislative policy development of the organization by serving on policy development committees to review proposed resolutions and assist the Legislative Department staff at the National Convention.




The 5 Best Reasons to Join the Grange
